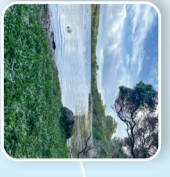
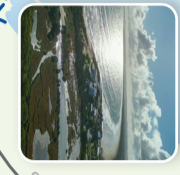

## About Little Dip Conservation Park

Located just south-east of Robe, Little Dip Conservation Park is one of South Australia's most diverse coastal landscapes. The park combines rugged limestone headlands, pristine beaches, freshwater lakes, towering sand dunes and coastal heathland, creating an ever-changing environment for visitors to explore.

Nature lovers can discover abundant birdlife, native wildlife and seasonal wildflowers, while artists and photographers are rewarded with dramatic coastal scenery, crystal-clear waters and untouched natural beauty around every corner.

For adventure seekers, Little Dip offers some of the region's most popular 4WD tracks, winding through soft sand dunes and linking remote beaches and secluded fishing spots. Walking trails provide access to spectacular lookouts, hidden coves and peaceful lakeside environments, making the park equally appealing to casual walkers and experienced hikers.

Whether you're seeking a quiet nature escape, a coastal adventure, fishing opportunities or an authentic South Australian wilderness experience, Little Dip Conservation Park delivers a memorable connection with the region's unique natural environment.

## Big Dip & Eliza Lake loop

3.4 km loop • 45-60 mins  
To discover different habitats of salt tolerant vegetation take a walk along the Big Dip Lake to Lake Eliza which rewards you with views of the Woakwine Range. Lake has various birds depending on seasons and lake volume.



Take a quiet stroll through a canopy of coastal mallee. Small bush birds and waterbirds such as black ducks, swans, musk ducks and white-faced herons can be seen along the walk. No accessible friendly with slight undulation.

## YOUR NATURAL CONNECTION

Set along South Australia's spectacular Limestone Coast, Robe, 333km from Adelaide and 580km from Melbourne, is a destination shaped by water, wilderness and a rich maritime heritage. Framed by the wild Southern Ocean, connected coastal lakes and sweeping beaches with rugged headlands bordering the highly diverse **Little Dip Conservation Park**.

The local Aboriginal tribe of the Robe region are the Bunganditj People, whose connection to the lands, coastline, wetlands and waters of the Limestone Coast extends back thousands of years through a rich cultural heritage of knowledge, storytelling and custodianship.

Robe offers a unique blend of natural beauty and small-town heritage charm and stories. Historic stone buildings, cottages and major South Australian landmarks which reflect the town's important role as one of South Australia's busiest ports during the 1800s, creating a strong sense of place and story that can still be felt today.

Robe's connection to the landscape is embracing. Coastal walking trails weave between rugged headlands, sheltered bays and pristine beaches, while nearby lakes, wetlands and conservation areas support abundant birdlife and native wildlife.

Robe is the kind of place where visitors:

~ breathe deeply and;  
~ experience the changing moods of the coast, from wild ocean swells to calm waters and endless horizons.

For those seeking adventure, Robe delivers experiences as diverse as the landscape itself. Four-wheel driving through coastal dunes, exploring remote wild beaches, kayaking, fishing, surfing, mountain biking and nature-based experiences all provide opportunities to discover the region from a different view.

Whether you're chasing outdoor adventure, exploring local history or simply reconnecting with nature, Robe offers an authentic coastal experience that leaves a lasting impression.

## ROBE'S RICH HERITAGE

Robe was officially established in 1846 and named after Frederick Holt Robe, the fourth Governor of South Australia. During the mid to late 1800s, Robe developed into one of the colony's busiest ports, exporting wool, livestock and agricultural products from the surrounding pastoral districts.

The town's strategic location on Guichen Bay made it an important trading centre, and many of the historic stone buildings, warehouses and cottages that line the streets today are reminders of this prosperous maritime era.

Robe's unique place in Australia's migration history. Between 1857 and 1863, thousands of Chinese migrants landed at Robe before making the journey overland to the Victorian goldfields, avoiding restrictive landing taxes imposed elsewhere.

This remarkable chapter helped shape the town's story and is recognised as an important part of Australia's multicultural heritage. Today, Robe's well-preserved historic precincts, landmarks and heritage trails allow visitors to step back in time and discover the people, industries and events that helped build this iconic coastal town.

- 4 Knot speed limit to all other vessels

**RESTRICTED AREA 2 (Orange area)**

- No vessels or skiing permitted

**RESTRICTED AREA 3 (Blue area)**

- Water skiing only (no swimming permitted)
- Max speed 65 km/h
- Max number of boats engaged in water-skiing at any one time is 8 boats
- Water skiing only between 8am and sunset or 8pm (whichever is earlier)
